

## TEEN STUFF



## BOOK GROUP



Last year, Liz Stark suggested we start a reading group which a small group of us enjoyed over the session. The group wants to continue, and aims to read five books between September and next May, roughly every second month (so not too arduous!): we are planning a mix of novels and non fiction- some have Christian themes, some don't, but we hope to bring a Christian perspective to the reading and discussing of these books.

Please do not panic that this is going to be an intellectual analysis or anything of the sort – there will be no tests! Instead everyone will have the chance to give their impressions of the books, although that is not compusory either.

Our first meeting is planned for Tuesday, 24<sup>th</sup> September in the Loudon Room at the church- the date may change to suit those keen to join us.

The first book we will be reading is **The Vanishing Act of Esme Lennox** by Maggie O'Farrell – I have a spare copy if you think you'd like to give it a go.

The second book for discussion in November will be **Audacity to Believe** by Sheila Cassidy, the story of a young British/Australian doctor who goes to Chile in the early 1970's to widen her experience, and finds herself imprisoned by the Pinochet regime. Her faith is challenged and deepened by these experiences and I found it a very gripping read, when I first read it in the late 1970's.






