## Strathaven Avendale Old and Drumclog Memorial Parish Church Trustees' Report Year ended 31 December 2024

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 1 January 2019.

#### Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, reformed in tradition, and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Avendale and Drumclog is a thriving church with many activities outside the normal worship services. These include House groups/bible study, prayer groups online and in person, 40 day bible/prayer events. A Good Friday day of prayer takes place as well as a variety of services at Christmas including lessons and carols and 'Christmas in the Country'. Bethany group continues, providing support weekly for bereaved and lonely folks. Other activities include Haven coffee weekly, craft clubs, prayer walks, Take Time (held in church and also the local library), Drumclog Guild.

Avendale & Drumclog present a show on local radio each week, hosted by the minister or elders and focused on Christian music and comment.

As well as regular Sunday meetings, our young people's activities include mum's & tots, buglets, messy church (which we took into a local primary school for the first time), Ignite 'youth' worship, Haven hangout, study zone and a holiday club.

We also host over 12 external groups in the church on a regular basis – an opportunity to get alongside secular groups with our witness.

We give to a number of Christian charities and organisations including MAF, Sat7,HHI, Tearfund, Loaves & fishes.

A strategic plan has been produced for the years 2025 – 2027 with revised objectives for the working groups – each objective linked to the five marks of mission.

#### Achievements and Performance

Several missional activities have taken place including "invite the neighbours" where 34 non church goers came to Drumclog one Sunday.

We have started working closely with 2 of the local primary schools where there is a real need for help and support. Currently 20 volunteers from the church assist in several areas and greater involvement is planned in the coming year. We also provide transport for the schools and parents to attend Christmas, Easter and end of term services in our church.

Haven coffee is held weekly and has enabled attendance by various groups including Christians against Poverty and Citizens advice.

A Super Sunday open air church service was held in August with a BBQ and games afternoon to follow. Street Food Sunday was held in Autumn with non-members invited to join for worship and various food stalls throughout the church.

Drumclog Guild celebrated its 90th birthday during the year and an event was held to mark it.

We went out into the community with stands at community events such as the Gala Day.

A men's breakfast takes place monthly in a local café with many non-church goers attending. This includes a short thought for the day given by an elder.

A group for younger men and a women's group have started over the year with 10-20 attending each one.

A music/singing group started to encourage members to further participate in worship.

A small quiet family room has been created within the church building. This is used in many formats, including the ability to live stream the Sunday worship.

We held quiz nights to raise funds for Christian charities.

An updated sound and vision system was installed in Avendale to cater for the large praise band and also provide improved experience of worship for both attendees and on-line viewing.

Over the course of the year, a total of 17 new members joined, many by Profession of Faith.

#### Financial Review

The principal source of income is from weekly offerings. Income from offerings for the year amounted to £117,360 (2023 £116,588) an increase of 0.66 %.

The Kirk Session, through the Treasurer and Finance Committee, is responsible for the financial affairs of the Church. Each year the congregation has to pay a Giving to Grow amount to the Church of Scotland and Presbytery Dues to the Presbytery of Forth Valley and Clydesdale. In 2024 these amounts were £79,056 to Giving to Grow and £2,595 to Presbytery. The former is paid by monthly Standing Order, and the same arrangements will remain in place to pay amount in respect of Giving to Grow for 2025. To ensure that the Kirk Session and congregation are kept informed of the financial state of affairs the Treasurer issues a budget update at each Trustees meeting as well as ad-hoc updates as and when required throughout the year.

The contribution to Giving to Grow is used to pay 100% towards the cost of the ministry allocated to Avendale and Drumclog. In addition to this the contribution also goes towards the cost of ministry in other places. This is helping to support and sustain congregations who are not currently in a position to cover the cost of the ministries allocated to them. All congregations are also paying a contribution towards shared activities – that is this activities, programmes and services provided by the Church nationally.

## Risk Management

Avendale is an aging building that requires routine repairs and maintenance. To ensure this is achieved a fabric fund has been generated and an annual budget assigned to meet ongoing maintenance costs.

Avendale and Drumclog have an aging congregation, although a number of new younger members joined the Church over the last year, which could impact on future offerings and the ability to benefit from gift aid as they drop out of tax. Regular income monitoring is carried out and reported to the Kirk Session at each meeting to allow action to be taken as appropriate.

### Reserves Policy

The charity trustees have considered the reserves required and have taken into account their current and future liabilities. It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately 6 months expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted funds of £326,514 of which £35,703 had been designated for fabric fund and £186,450 has been designated for specific projects as agreed by the trustees and £29,286 to the worship fund. The other groups funds total £8,225 and the remaining balance of £66,851. The church also held £91,402 of restricted funds which have been provided for the purposes specified in Note 13.

Structure, Governance and Management

The congregation is a registered charity, number SC001956 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution (or Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form)) and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

Avendale and Drumclog Church is administered in accordance with the Unitary Constitution.

Although there are two places of worship, Avendale and Drumclog is one church, with one Minister, one Kirk Session, and one congregation.

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

The Kirk Session which meets six times a year is responsible for spiritual and temporal affairs of the church. Meetings to deal with specific issues as they arise may also be called during the year. The Kirk Session is made up of Work Groups and committees, namely: Prayer and Worship, Mission and Discipleship, Pastoral, Youth and Families, Finance, Fabric, Communications and Church and Community. These enable the Kirk Session to progress work efficiently.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024 which are set out on pages 11 to 22.

### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### Basis of independent examiner's statement



#### **Accounting Policies**

The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently in the current and preceding year in dealing with items which are considered material to the accounts, are set out below.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended)

#### Fund accounting

Funds are classified as either restricted funds or unrestricted funds, defined as follows.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the charity.

Endowment funds are funds which have been given on the condition that the original capital sum is not reduced, but the income there from is used for the purpose defined in accordance with the objects of the charity.

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

#### Incoming resources

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Donated services and facilities

Donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income when the charity has control over the item, any conditions associated with the donated item have been met, the receipt of economic benefit from the use by the charity of the item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS102) the general volunteer time of congregation members is not recognised.

On receipt, donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay to obtain services or facilities of equivalent economic benefit on the open market; a corresponding amount is then recognised as expenditure in the period of receipt.

#### Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

#### **Fixed Assets**

The charity has the right to occupy and use for its charitable objects certain tangible fixed assets, including the Church, halls and manse, vested in the Church of Scotland General Trustees. No consideration is payable for the use of these assets. Expenditure incurred on the repair and maintenance of these assets is charged as resources expended in the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which the liability arises.

#### Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. Unrealised gains and losses represent the difference between the market value at the beginning and end of the financial year or, if purchased in the year, the difference between cost and market value at the end of the year. Realised gains and losses represent the difference between the proceeds on disposal and the market value at the start of the year or cost if purchased in the year.

#### Taxation

Avendale Old and Drumclog Memorial Parish Church is recognised as a charity for the purposes of applicable taxation legislation and is therefore not subject to taxation on its charitable activities.

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review, the minimum stipend was £31,642 and the maximum stipend (in the fifth and subsequent years of service) £38,884

#### 8 Trustee Remuneration and Related Party Transactions

During the year 1 trustee received reinmbursed expenses of £4,651 (2023 £4,171). This relates to the Minister's expenses and manse council tax.

One trustee or a person related to a trustee had any personal interest in any contract or transaction entered into by the charity during the year. The church caretaker is also a trustee and is no longer in contract with the charity. Remuneration is £0 (2023 £4374) and pension £0 (2023 £84)

During the year a total of £35,253.92 (2023 £35,363.92) was donated to the congregation by trustees.
