**Restarting This Autumn** Sunday evening sessions exploring worship and deepening our faith.



**Next date 7th September 4-6pm** Do tell families you know and invite them to our ever popular monthly all age Messy Church.












# **Book Group**



The Church's summer read was this fantastic book by director of Care for the Family, Rob Parsons.

The narrative begins in 1975, when young lawyer, Rob and his wife, Dianne, open their door to find Ronnie Lockwood, a homeless man with a bag of belongings and a frozen chicken. What starts as a simple act of kindness, offering Ronnie a meal and shelter for the night evolves into an extraordinary journey of shared lives and enduring friendship as Ronnie stayed and was integrated into their family for the next 40 years!

The book highlights the remarkable turnarounds in both their lives: Ronnie, with the support of the Parsons, finds fulfillment and direction in life. Simultaneously, Rob leaves his law practice to establish Care for the Family, a charity driven by Christian compassion that strengthens family life and offers support to those facing difficulties.

This book explains the trials, turmoils, joys and challenges they faced with humour and compassion.

"A Knock at the Door" is a testament to the idea that love and acceptance can enable individuals who may be marginalized by society to flourish and contribute meaningfully. It emphasizes the importance of community and the profound impact of extending kindness to others, demonstrating that tomorrow doesn't always have to be like yesterday, regardless of your background or circumstances. A challenge and an encouragement to us all as Christians.
